

POSTAL SERVICES SAVED!

hose of you who have noticed that the Post Office has closed – do not despair! After thirty-three years trading as a grocery store and off licence, the Best One shop has come to the rescue, having taken on both the local post office services and the newsagents.

The new opening time for the shop will be 6am and for the post office counter there will be extended hours from 7.30am to 9pm on weekdays with a later opening for the shop of 9am on Sundays. The post box collection will still be at 2pm and 5pm, in the old position for now, but you can also hand letters in at the shop.



Here is a brief round-up of the post office services:

- banking services you can pay in and withdraw cash for free for most banks
- payment of household bills such as utilities and council tax
- Bureau de change up to 1000 Euros on demand and other currencies with more notice.

So, let's continue to reduce those short car journeys into town, that are so damaging to your car and the environment, by shopping locally!

What is the Neighbourhood Plan and why should I care?

The Radford Semele Neighbourhood Plan will be extremely important to the village. A Neighbourhood Plan is a legal document written by the local community and is how we, as residents, can enforce control of development in the local area in the future.

The policies it contains can relate to any planning matters such as housing, heritage, environment, views (of the land or sky for example) and community identity. It will have an impact on future housing, which must avoid our precious green spaces and take account of any valued views (of St Nicholas Church for example). A designated 'Green Space' has the same protection as Green Belt.

The NP is a community effort, having been drawn up so far by a group of interested villagers, so it is vital that as many people in the village read and comment on it before the deadline of 3rd April. The more people who comment on the Plan, which is in draft form at present, the more likely it is to be adopted by Warwick District Council. Once adopted, the Plan will last until 2029 though it will have to be reviewed regularly to ensure continued protection. Canal Access - Nearly there

FoRGE has been in negotiation to secure safe pedestrian and cycle access to the canal towpath west of the village where the canal crosses the A425. We are pleased to announce that discussions between FoRGE, the landowner and the Canal and River Trust (CRT) are at an advanced stage. A small triangle of land will be bought by the CRT in the next few months. We will then seek funding for construction work. Watch this space...

WILDLIFE IN SMALL GARDENS



It is tempting, when you have a small garden, to think "Oh well, there's nothing much I can do to help wildlife flourish," but some people do manage it. Both of these photos were taken in Radford Semele, one in Hatherall Road and one in Semele Close. As you can see, neither of these front gardens is particularly deep – in one case no more than two metres and yet both are mini havens for wildlife

This is thanks to clever planting which provides cover for a variety of creatures either by the addition of climbing plants on the fence, shrubs that can also provide food and in one case quite a substantial tree. It works – the nest boxes (inset photo) were all fully occupied last year.

But what about tree roots undermining foundations? The Royal Horticultural Society's website has a free plant finder section which allows you to state the size of tree and other factors and then gives you the options. Also, any responsible, proper nursery or garden centre will be able to advise you.

Just one word of warning – don't site nest boxes above a window unless you want to be cleaning it on a very regular basis for several weeks!

Allotments in Radford?

At the Neighbourhood Plan meeting at least six people said that they'd like allotments. The Parish Council is duty-bound to consider this if six counciltax-payers send them a letter requesting allotments in the village. Although it's not always possible for a Parish Council to find land, it is this level of local government that needs to investigate the request. This is the first public draft of the Radford Semele Neighbourhood Plan for consultation by the parish community, and any comments are welcome. The consultation period for written responses closes on April 3, and these will be incorporated into the document.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering group has, where relevant, taken on board all your previous comments. Where possible, any issues or suggestions which cannot be included in the Plan will be raised with the relevant authorities.

t's easy to complain to friends, neighbours and family about the hole in the road, the water running down the street, or the smell of gas.

But please report it. You might be the only person who does. There have been recent instances of gas and water leaks. Both leaks had been going on for weeks but nobody had reported them.

And the more people who report an incident the better – this tells the company or authority involved that the problem needs swift attention.

All the signs of Spring are here – bulbs pushing up, lengthening daylight, fat but hungry bumblebee queens emerging... And, we're still lucky round here to enjoy the child's delight of frogspawn – or is it toadspawn? How would you know the difference?

In November, we learned this when FoRGE hosted an open-to-all talk from Warwickshire Amphibian and Reptile Team ("WART", clearly, they see the funny side of life). Check out their web page: http://groups.arguk.org/wart. The group are a devoted team of volunteers who survey the quantity and spread of Warwickshire's frogs, toads, newts, snakes and lizards. The search for our "vanishing viper", the adder, is ongoing.

At this time of year, expect to see "strings" of toadspawn (as distinct from clumps of frogspawn) and look out for toads in the road! The male toad will use open habitats for seeking passing females, but often uses a road for this, where he can become trapped by the kerbs or killed by traffic. Check roadside drains if it is safe to do so, as you may be able to rescue a trapped amphibian.

Our very popular next talk in January was given by a representative from the Stour Valley Wildlife Action Group. The topic, Barn Owls, captured the imagination of many in the village. Some great film footage and photography helped narrate the story of how the SVWAG have encouraged more barn owls to nest in their area. Inspiration for us all, perhaps?

FORGE ECOLOGY GROUP

NATURE SPOTTERS NEEDED

The group is working on logging the results of last year's hedgerow survey onto the Warwickshire Wildlife database. Thanks to the QGIS computer program (the County system), this will eventually be capable of being displayed in a variety of ways, including map form. However, as a group, we are still learning – work in progress!

Meanwhile, we have plans to do a pond survey later in the year - please keep an eye on the

FoRGE website for further details, but Sunday 6th May is a provisional date for this.

In the meantime, we are hoping that people who spot any plants or animals around the parish can let us know about it. A short form for reporting what you see can be downloaded: goo. gl/QviKLZ and will hopefully take no more than five minutes to complete. It complies with the County system and so can be passed on easily.

It would be ideal if you could supply a photo of the creature/plant - camera phones are generally up to the job nowadays. (See examples on right).

We would also like as precise a location as possible, ideally a postcode or six figure grid reference. For grid references, try downloading GridReferenceFreeOS from Google Play Store onto your smartphone if you have one and don't forget to switch on your phone location. Happy hunting!
